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Discover Japan in 10 Days

Day 1 - Arrival in Tokyo

Top Attractions: Shinjuku, Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building, Kabukicho

Suggested Route: Arrive in Tokyo and transfer to your hotel. Spend the evening exploring Shinjuku, one of Tokyo's most vibrant districts. Visit the Tokyo Metropolitan Government Building for free city views, stroll through neon-lit Kabukicho, and enjoy your first Japanese dinner at a local izakaya.

Day 2 - Tokyo Icons & Tradition

Top Attractions: Asakusa (Senso-ji Temple), Nakamise Street, Tokyo Skytree, Sumida River

Suggested Route: Begin the day in Asakusa with a visit to Senso-ji, Tokyo's oldest temple. Walk along Nakamise Street for traditional snacks and souvenirs. Continue to Tokyo Skytree for panoramic city views. End the day with a relaxing walk or boat ride along the Sumida River.



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Day 3 – Modern Tokyo & Pop Culture

Top Attractions: Shibuya Crossing, Hachiko Statue, Harajuku, Meiji Shrine

Suggested Route: Visit Shibuya Crossing and the Hachiko Statue in the morning. Walk to Harajuku to explore youth culture and fashion streets. Escape the crowds at Meiji Shrine, set within a peaceful forest. Spend the evening shopping or dining in Shibuya.

Day 4 – Tokyo at Leisure

Top Attractions: Tsukiji Outer Market, Ginza, Odaiba

Suggested Route: Start with breakfast at Tsukiji Outer Market, sampling fresh sushi and street food. Head to Ginza for upscale shopping and architecture. In the afternoon, explore the futuristic waterfront district of Odaiba, easily reached from central Tokyo via the scenic Yurikamome Line, where you can look forward to shopping malls, entertainment complexes, seaside promenades, and iconic views of Rainbow Bridge and Tokyo Bay.

Day 5 – Tokyo to Kyoto (Bullet Train Experience)

Top Attractions: Shinkansen Journey, Gion District

Suggested Route: Travel from Tokyo to Kyoto by Shinkansen (bullet train), enjoying views of Mount Fuji on clear days. After hotel check-in, explore the historic Gion district, known for its traditional wooden houses and geisha culture. Enjoy a quiet evening stroll and local Kyoto cuisine.



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Day 6 – Kyoto Temples & Heritage

Top Attractions: Kinkaku-ji (Golden Pavilion), Ryoan-ji, Arashiyama Bamboo Grove

Suggested Route: Visit Kinkaku-ji in the morning, followed by Ryoan-ji's famous Zen rock garden. In the afternoon, head to Arashiyama to walk through the Bamboo Grove and explore the surrounding area. End the day with a riverside dinner.

Day 7 – Traditional Kyoto & Culture

Top Attractions: Fushimi Inari Shrine, Nijo Castle, Nishiki Market

Suggested Route: Start early at Fushimi Inari Shrine, walking through its iconic red torii gates. Visit Nijo Castle, once the residence of shoguns. Spend the afternoon at Nishiki Market, sampling Kyoto specialities and shopping for local crafts.



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Day 8 – Kyoto to Osaka

Top Attractions: Osaka Castle, Umeda Sky Building

Suggested Route: Travel to Osaka (approximately 30 minutes by train). Visit Osaka Castle and its surrounding park. In the evening, head to Umeda Sky Building for panoramic sunset views and dinner in the Umeda area.

Day 9 – Osaka Food & Entertainment Capital

Top Attractions: Dotonbori, Shinsaibashi, Kuromon Market

Suggested Route: Explore Kuromon Market in the morning, tasting Osaka's famous street food. Walk through the Shinsaibashi shopping arcade before heading to Dotonbori, known for its neon signs and lively atmosphere. Enjoy takoyaki and okonomiyaki for dinner.

Day 10 – Osaka Departure or Optional Excursion

Top Attractions: Optional Nara Visit

Suggested Route: Spend the morning shopping or relaxing in Osaka. Alternatively, if you have a late-night flight, take a short trip to Nara to visit Todai-ji Temple and Nara Park – it takes a few hours to explore properly, and Kansai International Airport is approximately one hour away, making it manageable before departure.

Top Landmarks to Capture in Japan



Shibuya Crossing, Tokyo

Best at 6–8 PM for neon city lights, dynamic crowd movement, and iconic night-time Tokyo atmosphere.



Senso-ji Temple, Asakusa

Best at 8–10 AM for soft morning light, fewer crowds, and clear views of temple architecture.



Fushimi Inari Torii Gates, Kyoto

Best at 7–9 AM for peaceful pathways, even lighting through the gates, and minimal foot traffic.



Osaka Castle, Osaka

Best at 9–11 AM for bright daylight, sharp architectural details, and reflections from the surrounding moat.



Dotonbori Street, Osaka

Best at 6–9 PM for illuminated signage, vibrant street life, and classic Osaka nightlife shots.

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
